WHAT IS THE LESSON OF פחד יצחק אלקי יצחק AND?

ַרָבָּי יָהוֹשָׁעַ אוֹמֶר... וְיָ**צֵר הַּרָע**... מוֹצִיאִין אֵת הַאַדָם : מו העולם Lustfulness brings you out of this

בָּן זוֹמָא אוֹמֶר, אֵיזֶהוּ גָבּוֹר, הַכּוֹבֶשׁ אֵת יִצְרוֹ Who is strong? One who overpowers his inclinations

QUESTION: Yitzchok is the posterchild for מבורה despite being the most passive of our avos- why? The 2 most prevalent answers are that he was willing to die at the Akeidah or that he strove to keep his fathers accomplishments intact BUT both of those answers dont describe גבורה as defined in Avos- Gevurah must have something to do with quenching the yetzer hara!?

ANSWER: At the end of the parsha, Yakov refers to G-d as "Pachad Yitzchak" ("Had not the God of my father, the God of Abraham and the *Fear* of Isaac, been for me") and the medrash explains that the pseudonym used (Pachad) is used instead of

the more usual אלוקי because the holy name is reserved for when one is completely holy which is only after death, when one is no longer challenged by his/her lusts. But at the beginning of the parsha, G-d refers to Himself as אלקי יצחק despite Yitzchok being alive!!!?? Rashi explains that since Yitzchok was blind, he was no longer tempted by his vetzer and thus was considered dead- if that is so, Elokei Yitzchok can be used indeed: אלקי יצחק Although we do not find in Scripture that the Holy One, blessed be He, associates His name with that of the righteous during their lifetimes by writing "the God of so-and-so," for it is said (Job 15:15): "Lo! He does not believe in His holy ones," [i.e., God does not consider even His holy ones as righteous until after their deaths, when they are no longer subject to the evil inclination. nevertheless, here He associated His name with Isaac because his eyes had become dim, and he was confined in the house, and he was like a dead person, the evil inclination having ceased from him (Tanchuma Toledoth 7).

So at last we found a connection of Yitzchok to gevurah indeed. Yitzchok is considered holy, even during his lifetime, because he unfortunately developed blindness which squelched his Yetzer Hara. He was, perhaps unwittingly, פּוֹבֵשׁ אַת יִצְרוֹ and therefore a true Gevurah of the ultimate sense (as per

But it is also worthwhile to point out the language of rashi: לפי שכָהו עֵינֵיו וכלוּא הָיַה בַבַּיִת, וֹהַרֵי הוא כִּמֵת, ויצר הרע פסק ממנו because his eyes had become dim, and he was confined in the house, and he was like a dead person, the evil inclination having ceased from him- without the Yetzer Hara, Yakov was really considered dead. On one hand lustfulness can bring us out of this world and isolate us (רָבִּי יָהוֹשָׁעַ אוֹמֵר... וְיָצֵר מָרָע... מוֹצִיאִין אֶת הָאַדָם מִן הַעוֹלַם), but on the other hand, we need this challenge to

overcome as that is what living is about. Yitzchok may have been the extreme conqueror of lustfulness by virtue of his blindness that made him "dead to the world", but for the rest of us, our very life depends on having lusts that we can hope/try to overcome/suppress.

TAKEAWAY MESSAGE/S: Yitzchok indeed is the posterchild of גבורה because he is the prototypical forefather who overcame lustfulness (even though it was not intentional!). In fact, G-d refers to Himself as אלסי יצחק while Yitzchok was alive because Yitzchok was so pure and not tempted anymore by his yetzer hara due to his blindness. For the rest of us, having lusts is what makes us alive, and a goal in life is to try to overcome/suppress these lusts, attaining גבורה.
